NCAA Clearinghouse Guide for Students & Parents

Charlotte Christian School students who plan to play intercollegiate sports at NCAA Division I, II or III schools must register with the NCAA Clearinghouse to establish both academic and amateurism eligibility. Below please find answers to frequently asked questions about this process.

Q: When should a student register with the NCAA Clearinghouse?

A: A student can register with the NCAA Clearinghouse at any point during high school, but we advise students to register during the summer between eleventh and twelfth grades.

Q: How does a student get registered with the NCAA Clearinghouse?

A: Registration is done electronically by the student at www.ncaaclearinghouse.net. From the main page, select “Prospective Student Athletes”, then select “Registration Form for US Students.” Complete the online form found on this page.

Q: What records need to be sent to the NCAA Clearinghouse?

A: The NCAA Clearinghouse requires that your SAT and/or ACT scores be sent directly from the testing agency. If you did not release your scores to the NCAA when you registered for the SAT or ACT, you will need to do so. You can release SAT scores at www.collegeboard.com and ACT scores at www.actstudent.org. The code for the NCAA Clearinghouse is 9999. In addition, you need to request that your transcript be sent to the NCAA Clearinghouse. Please see your counselor to make this request.

Q: If I transferred schools during high school, do I need to send my academic records from every school I've attended?

A: Yes. While your Charlotte Christian transcript will show your grades from every school, the NCAA Clearinghouse will only accept grades that come directly from the school where you took the classes. Contact the guidance office at each school you've attended to request that your records be sent.

Q: How will the NCAA Clearinghouse calculate my GPA?

A: The NCAA Clearinghouse will recognize only the classes that are on each school's "Approved Core Courses List". To view this list for Charlotte Christian School (or any other high school), please visit www.ncaaclearinghouse.net and select "Prospective Student Athletes" from the main page. From there, select "Approved Core Courses" and type in the name of the school whose list you'd like to view. You will also find convenient worksheets to help you calculate your GPA on your own by selecting "General Information" from the home page of the NCAA Clearinghouse website and then selecting "Guide for the College Bound Student Athlete."

Q: What are the academic eligibility requirements for NCAA sports?

A: These requirements are listed in detail at the NCAA Clearinghouse website, www.ncaaclearinghouse.net. From the main page of the website, select "General Information" and then select either "Division I Eligibility Standards" or "Division II Eligibility Standards."

Q: How do I know which colleges are NCAA Division I or II schools?

A: You will find a detailed list of all NCAA schools by selecting "General Information" from the home page of www.ncaaclearinghouse.net and then selecting "Schools Sponsoring NCAA Sports."

Q: How can I get in touch with the NCAA Clearinghouse to ask questions?
